The Summer Outreach Lunch **Program Continues This Year!**

Since 2018, the Summer Outreach Lunch Program has prepared and distributed thousands of healthy bagged lunches to elementaryaged children in the Kawartha Lakes throughout July and August. As many families in our community rely on school-run programs, the summer



months often bring anxiety surrounding food insecurity, leaving children burdened with the worry of not having enough to eat.

Through collaboration with Kawartha Lakes Food Source, The Salvation Army Lindsay, Kawartha Lakes Food Coalition, and the Haliburton, Kawartha, Pine Ridge District Health Unit, we are grateful to continue the program again this year! In the summer of 2022, we produced 588 lunches — 431 distributed to children and the **remainder to A Place Called Home and BGC Kawarthas** — and we are hoping to reach even more children this season.

As in years prior, lunches will be available every Wednesday and Friday at King Albert Public School and Queen Victoria Public School, but we are also excited to announce a third location, new this year! Starting in July, children can also visit the Dalton Branch Library in Sebright every Monday to receive their lunch. Please visit our website under 'News' for more details.



Food Banks Canada Helps Provide Hot Meals!

Food Banks Canada recently granted Kawartha Lakes Food Source with funding that allowed us to provide 1900 frozen, single serve meals to tenants at Kawartha Lakes Housing (KLH) Corporation. Meals

are made from scratch by a local caterer and include a protein, carbohydrates, and vegetables, for a healthy and well-balanced meal. KLH is responsible for all social housing in the City of Kawartha Lakes, where some of our most vulnerable population resides, often struggling to access their next meal. We're incredibly grateful that funding from Food Banks Canada has provided some guaranteed hot meals to tenants at KLH!



The Season of Fresh Produce is Upon Us!

Did you know KLFS can accept **fresh produce donations**? At our distribution centre, we have both a walk-in fridge and freezer that we use to store perishable foods for our member food banks and
